A New Members Orientation was organised by the Membership Subcommittee on 3 July 2021 via zoom to officially welcome the new members who have joined SAC since early 2021.


The Subcommittee shared their personal counselling journeys and the new members got to know more about SAC and the volunteering opportunities available.

Counselling and Supervision Hours

In consideration of the current Safe Management Measures, we are pleased to inform that the SAC EXCO has approved the extension of the recognition of video/tele-counselling hours and video supervision hours for the purpose of Registered Counsellor (RC) registration or renewal until further notice.

MOU with HKPCA

The Singapore Association for Counselling (SAC) and the Hong Kong Professional Counselling Association (HKPCA) signed a four-year Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to facilitate the establishment of a working relationship between the two associations.

This potentially leads to the conduct of various collaborative activities, including exploring the possibility of mutual recognition of specific type of membership, professional exchanges and joint research projects of direct relevance to practitioners, among other potential opportunities for collaboration under the MOU.

Incorporated in 1995, HKPCA is the largest, oldest and most established organization representing professional counsellors in Hong Kong. It has over 1,400 members and around 300 certified counsellors and 100 Approved Counselling Supervisors which constitute a broad representation of professional counsellors in Hong Kong.

Dr Frederick Low, President of SAC, spoke about the agreement, "The MOU brings the two Associations closer together, to explore areas for collaboration that are mutually beneficial in the years ahead."

Panel of Therapeutic Specialists (POTS)

The Family Justice Courts (FJC) has announced the establishment of the Panel of Therapeutic Specialists (POTS) to improve access to the spectrum of therapeutic services available to meet the diverse needs of families undergoing or concluding their legal proceedings in FJC. POTS will comprise qualified mental health and social science professionals from the private sector.

SAC is pleased to support the POTS initiative with our President, Dr Frederick Low, on board the Steering Committee, working with leaders of Singapore Psychological Society, College of Psychiatrists and the FJC to develop the professional requirements for POTS. Moving ahead, a POTS pilot is targeted to be launched in 2022.

Ministry Representatives to the Register of Counsellors Board

The SAC Register of Counsellors Board (RCB) plays a crucial role in upholding high professional standards amongst counsellors in Singapore by overseeing the review of new and renewal applications of Registered Counsellors status. The RCB ensures that only members in good standing and who possess the recognised training and experience be admitted and/or remain on the Register.

As part of the Board's strategic plan, SAC has invited representatives from the Ministry of Education (MOE) and the Ministry of Social & Family Development (MSF) to the RCB. This provides a common platform for MOE, MSF, and SAC to identify and be apprised of emerging trends relating to counsellor-regulation in Singapore and consequently, to review and recommend enhancements to the current registration scheme.

SAC is pleased to announce the appointments of Ms Malar Palaiyan, Lead Specialist, Guidance Branch from MOE, and Ms Nancy Ng, Director, Family Support Division from MSF as the Ministry Representatives to the RCB serving from 1 October 2021 to 30 September 2023.

Empathy Masterclass


